Drama: One Act Masterpieces – A Theatrical Excursion from Euripides to Ringwood

Instructor: Beverly True

In this course, participants will read aloud and discuss 10 one-act plays that are milestones in the history of theatre. They will begin with Greek drama and read through the centuries from Moliere to modern playwrights such as Chekov, Shaw, Beckett, and Canadian, Gwen Paris Ringwood. Ringwood's play "Still Stands the House" will take participants full circle back to the unity of Euripides and classical style.

Classes will be held from 10:30 to Noon on Wednesdays at the Tantramar Theatre, Victoria Street, Amherst. The first class will be on Wednesday, October 6.

Instructor, Beverly True, holds a Masters Degree in Library Science and is the retired chief librarian of the Cumberland County Regional Library Service. She was one of the founders of the Amherst Drama Society, she has directed several musicals, and continues to teach voice privately. Prior to her work as a librarian, Beverly achieved a Bachelor of Music degree in Vocal Pedagogy from the New England Conservatory of Music. She studied opera with Boris Goldovsky and Sarah Caldwell, and performed in the chorus of Berlioz's opera "Les Troyens" at the Boston Opera House. She also worked with the Arundel Opera Theatre in Maine and with Allenberry Playhouse in Pennsylvania, performing in opera, musical theatre, and drama.
