Life in the Times of the Tudors will explore life in England during the Tudor Age beginning with King Henry VII defeating Richard III at Bosworth in 1485 and ending with the death of Queen Elizabeth I in 1603. It will not only explore the political aspects of the times but also how the common people went about their lives during the same period.
