The College is a volunteer, seniors-governed, locally operated, membership-based organization providing non-credit courses for all seniors.

The purpose of the College is to enhance the quality of life for seniors by providing peer learning educational opportunities in a comfortable and affordable environment.

Modeled on the PEI Seniors' College, the Tanramar Seniors' College was established in the spring of 2008 with the first course offerings taking place in October 2008 in Sackville and Amberst.

The College has experienced steady growth since its establishment and now operates in the communities and surrounding areas of Sackville, Port Elgin, Dorchester, Shediac and Moncton New Brunswick and in Amherst, Nova Scotia.

# HOW WE OPERATE

Seniors, who have had experience in presenting information to others and have a skill or interest that other seniors want to learn about, teach most of the courses.

Courses are offered during three sessions-fall, winter and spring. Usually the courses are held once a week for up to 8 weeks and the sessions last from 2 to 3 hours.

The courses are held in the Amherst, Dorchester, Codiac, Port Elgin, Sackville and Shediac areas. There are no exams, no papers and no pressure; just the joy of learning with other interesting senior.

Registration takes place three times a year in four locations-Amherst, the Codiac region of NB, Sackville and Shediac.

Membership in the College is open to all who are 50 years or older. The fee for membership is \$100.00 a year and entitles a member to enroll in any number of courses during the three terms the College operates.

Volunteer members of four regional organizational committees are responsible for curriculum, obtaining and confirming instructors, arranging venues, and overseeing all the details involved in organizing, promoting, and delivering courses and activities in their region.

All the instructors and presenters who offer courses are volunteers. The college has one paid part time individual who is the coordinator of the College.
